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To send email, you need:

- An email account through an email provider; an email address; and the email address of the recipient.
- The Email Provider / Host:
 - Does NOT need to be the same as your internet provider;
 - Your Internet Service Provider might be Comcast;
 - Yet, you might get free email online through "webmail", i.e. Gmail, Yahoo, Hotmail, Outlook, etc.
- Other email providers can be:

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Address Format:

- Username@Email provider
- Be sure there are no spaces!

Email addresses are always written in a standard format that includes a **username**, the @ (at) symbol, and the **email provider's domain**.

The **username** is the name you choose to identify yourself.

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Inbox

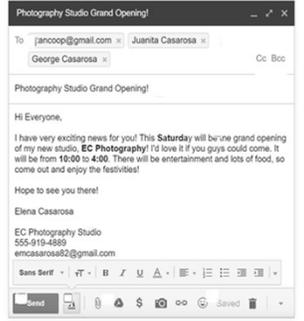
The **inbox** is where you'll view and manage **emails** you receive. Emails are listed with the name of the **sender**, the **subject** of the message, and the **date received**.

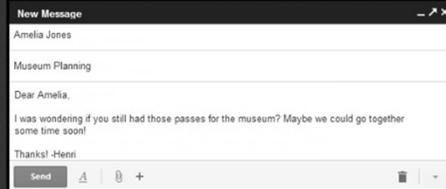

INCLUDE A GREETING



Just like a written letter, it's nice to add a greeting such as "Dear Amelia," and a closing line such as "Thanks," then your name.

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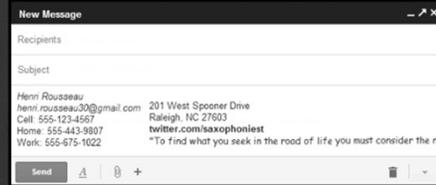
BE CLEAR AND CONCISE



People are more likely to read an email if they know what it's about, so be sure to include a relevant subject line. Avoid long or rambling messages, but provide enough detail to make the email clear.

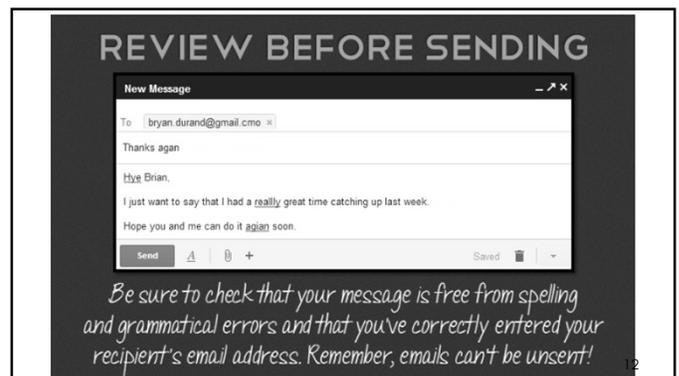
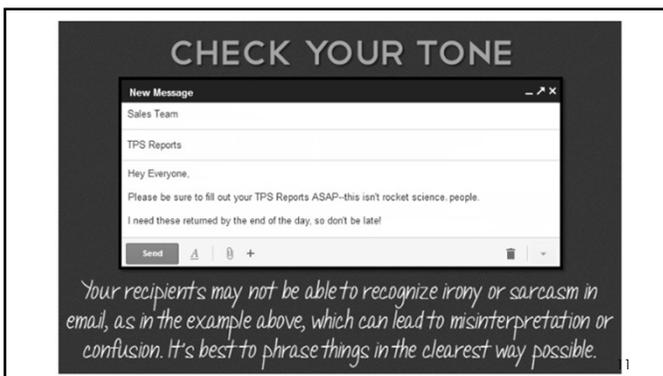
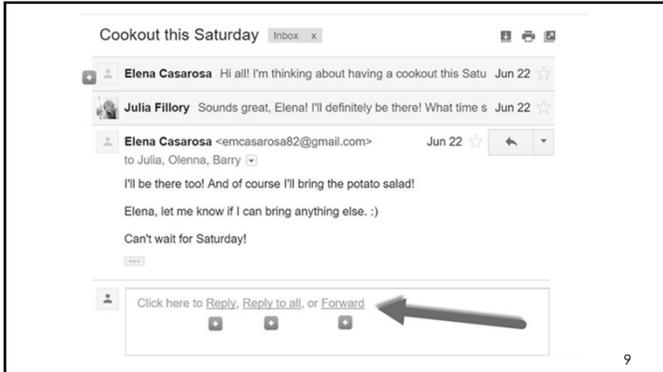

USE A SHORT SIGNATURE



Many people create elaborate signatures with lots of contact information. However, this can make it hard to know how you want to be contacted. Include only your preferred contact info.

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CHECK YOUR RECIPIENTS

Make sure your email is addressed to the right people, especially when sending a reply. In the example above, the message criticizes the original sender while accidentally including him as a recipient.

LIMIT TEXT FORMATTING

Your email service may have various text formatting options, but be aware that formatting can make your emails difficult to read. Excessive text formatting can also look unprofessional.

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AVOID CAPS LOCK

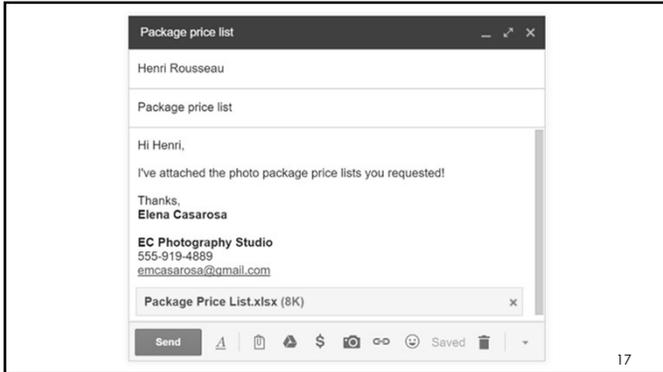
Writing in all capitals is equivalent to shouting online. Your recipient may mistakenly think that you're angry or upset. Also, emails written in all caps are much more difficult to read.

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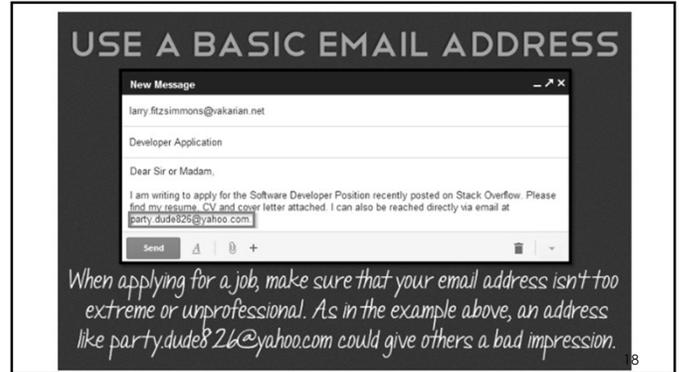
IGNORE CHAIN EMAILS

Chain emails can spread quickly because they are forwarded to lots of people, who then forward them to others, and so on. Many are hoaxes, and even those that aren't may annoy your recipients.

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Setting the Tone: Formal vs Casual

	Formal	Casual
Audience	Business and work colleagues	Family, Friends, and Familiar Coworkers
Greeting and Sign-Off	Dear Mr./Mrs Jones; Warm Regards	Hi John!; Cheers
Abbreviations and Word Choice	Thank you for your time and consideration, I look forward to hearing back from you.	Thanks! Looking forward to it, talk to you soon! :)
Use of Contractions	I will be able to attend the conference this year. I am looking forward to meeting with you again.	I'll be there, can't wait to see you!

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Here's an example...

An applicant is emailing a recruiter she's never met. The formal greeting and language she uses give her email a more professional tone.



Similarly, you want to make sure you're closing your email in a way that matches the greeting of your email. Ending an email with simply **Thanks!** may sound friendly, but it can come off as too familiar and casual. For more formal emails, your best bet is to close with something like **Thank you very much** or **Best regards** to maintain a professional tone.

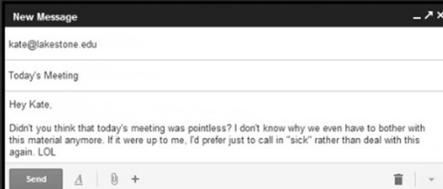

Keep in mind that your company may read your email. As in the example above, you should never send anything derogatory or offensive about your coworkers or your workplace.

Similar Addresses

Scammers often create websites and email addresses that use slight variations of the real address. If you look closely at this address, you'll notice that it's actually from bankofamerca.com.

Logo Fraud

It's easy to make a copy of any logo. This one looks identical to Bank of America's official logo, but it doesn't make it any more authentic.

Misleading Link

Just because this link says www.bankofamerica.com doesn't mean that's where it will go. We recommend not clicking on the following links from this type of email. Instead, type the web address into the address bar.

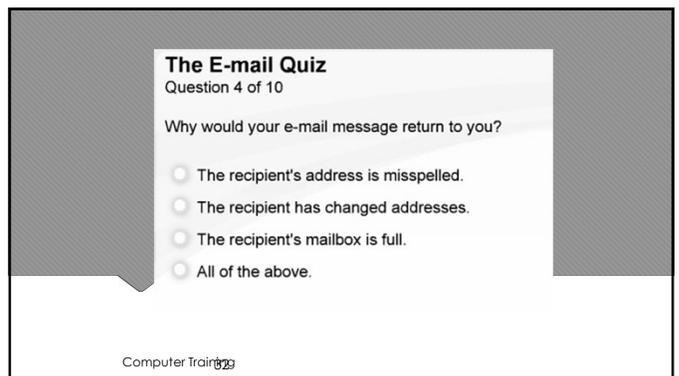
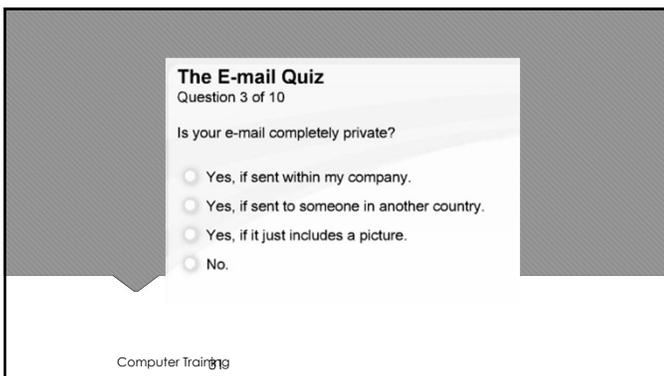
